

From The Pastor's Desk



August 2025

Greetings... First Baptist Church Westwood & Friends

"For the eyes of the Lord range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him." II Chronicles 16:9

The above verse is in the Old Testament of the Holy Bible. It is a reminder of the Lord's constant and loving watch care of those whose hearts are authentically true to Him.

It was striking to find this blessed promise mentioned during words of judgement from the Lord to an Israelite leader who became indifferent to Divine accountability and began to despise godly counsel. We are to heed the Divine lessons and warnings shared in biblical accounts such as this. Humans tend to desire 'alliances of power' among themselves. In arrogance they don't seek God's guidance nor blessing. Hence the fall from grace begins...

"For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight.

Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account." Hebrews 4:12-13

Indifference or unbelief regarding the reality of human accountability to God will always be prevalent among those who claim to be God's. One example from antiquity (B.C.) is in the Old Testament book of Judges. It records periods of religious-spiritual decay and moral chaos among God's people. Rather than trying to be godly people, a stabilizing presence; beacons of light for the path to Creator God's redemptive plan on earth they fell short. A sobering recurring theme starts at Judges 17:6 (repeated in 18:1, 19:1) and ending in Judges 21:25. "In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as they saw fit." "In those days Israel had no king; everyone did what was right in their own eyes." Judges is merely one record of periods when evil's oppressive and shameful deeds controlled hearts and there was no remedy but thank You Father, for sending Your Son, The Christ, The Messiah!

Now, let us share a moment of praise. Shout Hallelujah!! Because the very God who Scripture says "judges our thoughts and attitudes of heart" has granted you and I amazing grace and undeserved mercy! We can agree with Job's testimony: "For He wounds, but He also binds up; He injures, but His hands also heal." Job 5:18 The Lord Jesus Christ has healed us by His shed blood and Divine forgiveness. We have been delivered from all our sin (past, present, future) and from sin's domination! In Christ the power of God keeps us faithful as we are being sanctified and set apart for the day of His return!

Friends, we know that God is Spirit, as Christ taught in John 4:24. God does not have physical eyes like his creatures. God stands outside of Creation. God is Sovereign and holds Supreme Providence. Our gift of faith empowers us to comprehend biblical metaphor, etc. that the Lord uses to warn, teach, train and mold us into the "true worshipers [who] will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks." God IS present! God IS assessing human hearts!

Yes, the world is harsh and dismal to say the least, but refuse to be intimidated by evil's works of division, cruelty, injustice, and mercilessness among multitudes of **innocents and vulnerable** both young and old. Evil unfolds in households and among nations. Pray!!! for residents and communities. Pray!!! for mercy upon all nations. Most importantly, live faithful to Jesus teachings and stand firm against temptation. Receive your new mercies from God each morning for *great is God's faithfulness!* Obey Christ by planting your Gospel seeds! (see July's writing) Talk to people who know you about why your hope rests in Jesus Christ. With courage obey God in small acts of faith that the Spirit shows you.

Take heart! We go in God's strength and have Christ's power over fear!

Declare with me Psalm 28:7-8!!

"The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me.

My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him.

The Lord is the strength of his people,..."

God bless you as you continue enjoying Summer and planting of your Gospel seeds!



Pull-Tabs for Shriners Hospital

Are you aware that for years we've been collecting pull-tabs from beverage cans — and we're still doing it? Why? Here's the story.

Shriners Hospitals in Springfield and Boston have been collecting pull-tabs or "pop-tops" from beverage cans since 1989, recycling them, and putting the money toward programs that directly benefit children. The pull-tabs are the only pure aluminum part of the beverage can, and there are approximately 1,200 to 1,400 tabs in one pound. Since the program's inception, about a half-million pounds of aluminum tabs have been collected and recycled.

We donate the tabs to the Shriners' Burns Hospital – Boston. Neil Patterson coordinates this project, and Ken Shaw delivers the tabs to the hospital. There is a plastic jug in the Reception Room at church where you can leave the tabs you have removed from beverage cans.

Their website reminds us that Shriners' Children's Hospitals are "always here for our patients, regardless of a family's ability to pay or insurance status".

You can help a Shriner help a child. Donate pull-tabs for recycling.

The Event was a gathering of approx. 80 including alumni, professors, and local churches who support the Women's Council mission of providing enrolled students with scholarship funds.




We are pleased to announce that we received donations totaling **\$1,227.27**

A LETTER FROM YOUR WORLD RELIEF OFFICER

Dear American Baptist Church members,

I love Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of these verses in Matthew 5, and the clear commission they give to show up brightly in the world and be generous with our lives. That is the invitation extended in this year's One Great Hour of Sharing theme, Be the Light.
