

From The Pastor's Desk

Greetings...

First Baptist Church Westwood & Friends

It can be difficult for even the most faithful and biblically literate Christian to reckon with the words of the Apostle Paul in **Romans 8:28**: "And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them." (New Living Translation) How does Sovereign God cause our bad experiences like spiritual disobedience, doubt, and crises of faith end up serving God's will and result in good for us?

Do you know what it feels like to be ridiculed for your belief in the Holy Bible and in Jesus Christ being God the Son? Have you been made to feel unintelligent when standing up for Christian values and principles? Maybe you went silent because focusing on personal inadequacies prevented you from looking to God's patient grace in Christ.

How can being ridiculed or doubting God along the faith journey be used for a godly result?

Only when we admit that these feelings are present within and injuring our faith. The Word teaches us how to fight the good fight of faith! We defend our faith using God's power!

The Apostle Paul explained to the early believers:

"Indeed, we live as human beings, but we do not wage war according to human standards; for the weapons of our warfare are not merely human, but they have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every proud obstacle raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ." II Corinthians 10:3

Handwrite the above verses, II Corinthians 10:3-5, and I Corinthians 1:18 below. This will help commit them to memory and you won't regret it for these verses will serve you well on the Christian journey.

"For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." I Corinthians 1:18

Respond to the questions, use the prompts to help meditate and pray about your answers:

- 1. Have you ever felt foolish for believing the Holy Bible is true? Breathe and acknowledge doubts and fears before God. Pray for God's grace.
- 2. Do you ever struggle with your beliefs?

 Breathe and acknowledge doubts and fears. Tell the Lord why you struggle.
- 3. Do you struggle with *knowing* the truth versus *living* the truth? *Breathe and acknowledge doubts and fears. Ask God for grace to help live the truth.*
- 4. Do you shy away when others think Christian beliefs are foolish?

 Don't shy away now, God knows your answer but there is no condemnation.
- 5. Take as long as you need with these closing prompts:

 Trust the Holy Spirit to capture any thoughts of doubt you have right now.

 Move away from any thoughts of doubt.

 Move away from any thoughts of fear and lostness.

 Center yourself in God's grace surrounding you.

Remember that Jesus prayed for Peter's faith not to fail. Jesus is still interceding for us!

"Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift each of you like wheat. But I have pleaded in prayer for you, Simon, that your faith should not fail. So when you have repented and turned to me again, strengthen your brothers."





Pull-Tabs for Shriners Hospital

Are you aware that for years we've been collecting pull-tabs from beverage cans – and we're still doing it? Why? Here's the story.

Shriners Hospitals in Springfield and Boston have been collecting pull-tabs or "poptops" from beverage cans since 1989, recycling them, and putting the money toward programs that directly benefit children. The pull-tabs are the only pure aluminum part of the beverage can, and there are approximately 1,200 to 1,400 tabs in one pound. Since the program's inception, about a half-million pounds of aluminum tabs have been collected and recycled.

We donate the tabs to the Shriners' Burns Hospital – Boston. Neil Patterson coordinates this project, and Ken Shaw delivers the tabs to the hospital. There is a plastic jug in the Reception Room at church where you can leave the tabs you have removed from beverage cans.

Their website reminds us that Shriners' Children's Hospitals are "always here for our patients, regardless of a family's ability to pay or insurance status".

You can help a Shriner help a child. Donate pull-tabs for recycling.







Donation requests from The Westwood Food Pantry

- 1. Please do not travel to the stores just to pick up donated itemsinstead we suggest that you purchase a few donation items during your regular shopping trip, especially if they are on sale.
- 2. You can bring your items to worship on Sunday.

Suggested items:

- Canned Soups -especially Progresso (Vegetable types, Clam Chowder, etc)
- Canned Vegetables (Peas, Corn, etc.)
- · Canned Baked Beans
- Canned Fruit (Pineapple, Fruit Cocktail, Peaches, Pears, Mandarin Oranges, etc.)
- Canned Beef Stew, Hash, Chili with Meat)
- Spaghetti Sauce (small 24 -25-ounce jars)

Other "Always Needed" Popular Items

- Health & Beauty Aids (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste etc.)
- Diapers
- L or XL Depends
- Cleaning Products (dish detergent, laundry detergent, etc.)
- · Cake mixes and frosting
- Canned White Albacore Tuna in water
- Canned Chicken (5-ounce cans or small pouches)

Volunteers:

At this time they have all the volunteers they can use, but their needs may change at any time. If you or your high school or college-aged student is interested in volunteering at the Food Pantry, please email westwoodfoodpantry@gmail.com.

(Sorry, but they are unable to accept volunteers younger than 9th grade.)

The Westwood Food Pantry is available to all residents of Westwood who are experiencing temporary or long-term food insecurity.
